When should I speak to a trusted adult?

Remember, everything about you matters: your health, safety and body are all vital. If anyone is doing anything to these areas that makes you feel uncomfortable or that you don't give consent to, tell a trusted adult.

Tell a trusted adult if someone is:

- Bullying you
- Saying things to upset you or make you feel uncomfortable
- Touching you in places you don't consent to
- Hitting you or hurting you
- Sending unkind messages on the Internet or to your phone
- Taking your belongings

What is safeguarding?

At Grand Avenue Primary School, it is really important to us that you are kept safe, healthy and protected while at school. All adults in school are trusted and are able to help you protect your rights through safeguarding.
